Dean Academics ensures the preparation of workloads, time-tables for different disciplines and well defined unitization of syllabus by each staff member. Well stocked Library . Seminars, Workshop, extension lectures are also organized. Teachers are encouraged to attend Faculty Development Program such as Orientation Programs, Refresher Courses, Seminars and Workshops. Faculty Members are also encouraged to undertake research activities.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

To evaluate performance of the students, 1<sup>st</sup> Term and 2<sup>nd</sup> Term House Tests are conducted in September and December according to University rule results are sent to their parents. Internal assessment based on the marks secured by students in house tests will be sent to the Controller of Exam P.U. through software provided by the University. Different type of evaluation methods and transparency is achieved. University appointed examination officers to ensure smooth conduct of University exams. College appoints Centre Supdt., Deputy Supdt., Asstt. Supdts. and other staff for the exams. Teacher-wise results are examined by the Governing Body of the college. To evaluate the performance of teaching and learning, feedback is taken from students, alumni, parents and other stakeholders.

Special Tests and Remedial classes are held.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The college encourages the teachers for research work. The college is already having 07 Ph.D teachers. Teachers are encouraged to attend Seminars/Conferences'/Workshops and submit proposals for projects. Eminent scholars / researchers are invited to deliver extension lectures for the benefits of students. During 2009-10, 02 faculty members presented research papers at National Conferences and 04 at State Level Conferences.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college have well stocked library. During 2009-10, 1122 Text-Books worth Rs. 231131, 53 Reference Books worth Rs. 32465, 75 Journals worth Rs. 28115 were purchased. Regular updating the Labs, General and account offices are computerized, Teachers are encouraged to teach with LCD Projectors and OHP projectors. A sum of Rs. 86510 was spent on the maintenance and upgradation of Computer facility. Regular upgradation of infrastructure is done.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

IQAC allocates subjects to the teaching staff according to their area of specialisation and experience. College Advisory Committee, Examination Committee, Library Committee etc. along with Dean Academics, Dean Co-academics and Dean Sports plan and implement the activities of the session. #### The Practice:-

The institution organizers a number of activities to achieve the goal of women empowerment. The activities aiming at the authorization of women are as following:-
