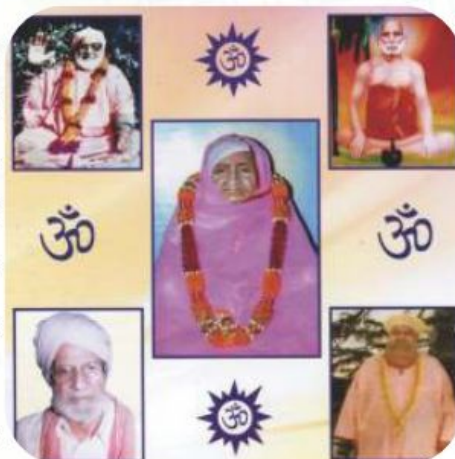


COLLEGE Profile

NAAC Accredited with 'A' Grade, (result declared on 25th May, 2016) our college is a well established institution situated in semi-urban area, imparting education in 04 undergraduate courses B.A., B.Com, B.C.A., B.Sc.(Fashion Designing) 05 Post Graduate Courses, M.A. Economics*, M.Sc. Mathematics, M.A. Sociology and PGDCA and two Add On Courses, one Communicative English and another Computer Based Accounting. In the beginning the college was providing a choice of only 8 elective subjects, but the number of subjects has now swelled up to 14. Besides 2 compulsory subjects (English and Punjabi) the students have the option to select three elective subjects out of 14 subjects which are Elective Punjabi, Hindi, English, Sanskrit, History, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, Home Science*, Music (Instrumental), Mathematics, Computer Science, Physical Education, and Classical Dance. It is compulsory for the students to study Environmental Education as a non credit qualifying course at the under graduate level. Besides this, at present the college is running various Crash Courses, such as:-

- A candidate who has passed +2 examination from Punjab School Education Board or another School Board can get admission within normal Admission dates. If result of +2 is late due to some reasons she can be admitted within ten days of declaration of result. Her lectures will be counted from the date of admission.
- A candidate whose result of the examination is notified as late may be allowed to join the next higher class provisionally. In case she is declared as "Failed" her admission shall stand cancelled and she will be reverted to the lower class. She will have no claim against the institution. Fee paid by her for the higher class will be adjusted for the lower class. But in case she discontinues her studies, fee will not be refunded.
- A candidate whose result is declared late by the University can join the college within 10 days from the declaration of the result.
- Students belonging to schedule caste and other backward classes require to fill in their scholarship forms alongwith documents at the time of admission.
 - Caste certificate issued by specific authorities.
 - Income certificate of parents.
 - Domicile Certificate & Aadhar Card of Student, Mother & Father

NOTE:

If any student fails to attach the caste certificate alongwith her admission form, full fee will be charged from the student.

- A student who is placed in compartment in the lower class of the college can join the next higher class provisionally.
- a) A candidate securing less than 20% in the subject of compartment of the +2 examination held in session 2022-2023 is eligible to join the 1st year of the degree course during the

session 2023-2024, if she passes the supplementary examination to be held in the month of August, 2023 or before August, 2023, the last date given in the admission schedule approved by the Panjab University, Chandigarh.

- b) 20% marks implies Theory and Practical taken together.
7. A student seeking admission on the basis of qualification obtained from other University or Board will obtain eligibility certificate from the University.
8. Students coming from the other University/Board can seek Admission to the college provisionally subject to the confirmation of the same by the Panjab University, Chandigarh. In case the previous examination passed by them is in the approved list of "Equivalence of Examination" supplied by the Registrar Panjab University, Chandigarh. Application for admission shall be made on prescribed form which is available from the office.
9. Following original certificates must be shown at the time of admission:-
 - a) Lower Examination passed
 - b) Provisional certificate issued by the head of Institution last attended.
 - c) Character certificate from the last attended institution.
 - d) Caste certificate from the students belonging to schedule caste or other backward class.
10. The reservation of seats shall be governed as per the regulations of the University.
11. For admission, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage would not be marked off to the advantage of the candidate, i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50%
12. The candidate should not have been disqualified by any Board/Council/University while getting admission.
13. Candidates who have passed +2 examination without English from any recognised Board/Council/University are eligible to join T.D.C, if they fulfill their requirement for admission such as minimum percentage of marks etc.
14. The college is affiliated to Panjab University Chandigarh for all the subjects and courses.

MIGRATION RULES

1. No student can migrate from one college to another college in the same city. Candidates from other colleges affiliated to the Panjab University, Chd. can migrate by seeking prior permission of the Principal and the University after obtaining a College Leaving Certificate from the previous college.
2. No migration to the college shall be allowed unless student seeking migration brings migration certificate from the previous college. Students who want to migrate to this college are advised to contact the office.
3. Deficient Subject (for Migration cases from other University) -Admission of a student from other University can be made on the condition that such student will have to- clear the deficient subject/s if any, within the permissible chances prescribed under the regulations by University.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE STUDENTS

1. Students of B.A. Ist can take one language as elective subjects out of English/Hindi/Punjabi/Sanskrit.
2. Students who have practical subjects, may have to stay up to 4.p.m. in the College.
3. Principal can refuse those subject combinations, which are not available in the college, Principal is fully authorized to decide about the subject combinations.
4. If University changes some subject combination after the publication of prospectus, students will have to study the subjects according to the decision of the University.
5. Subjects will remain the same in B.A I*, II, & III.
6. A student once admitted to B.C.A. Part I and B.Com Part I will have to complete the course in the college. Migration will be allowed only on the condition that the student pays the full fee of the entire course.
7. A candidate who has not passed English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination shall be allowed to get admitted in B.Com I but she will have to clear English as a deficient subject. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances offered to her subsequent to the date of admission, her provisional admission to B.Com I Examination will stand cancelled.
8. Environment and Road Safety Education is a compulsory subject carrying a maximum of 100 marks for undergraduate students of all streams (Arts, Commerce and Computer Applications). The candidates are required to pass the subject with at least 33% marks in 1st/2nd/3rd year of the course.
9. Students will deposit their fee according to the schedule of dates notified on the notice board. Those who do not deposit their fee according to schedule will be fined Re. 1-00 per day and they shall have to deposit their fee within 10 days, other-wise their name will be struck off from the college rolls. After that, if students want to take re-admission, they have to pay Rs. 170/- as re-admission fee.
10. Names of those students will be struck off from the college rolls, who remain absent continuously for 7 days without intimation.
11. All securities not withdrawn within 12 months of the date of leaving the college will lapse automatically.
12. Compartment students only: +2 compartment students who are admitted in B.A.I classes will have to submit their original +2 certificate of compartment positively.
13. All the students must read the prospectus carefully.
14. Principal can refuse admission to any student without telling any reason.

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COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS

1. General Assembly:

The college has provision of holding a General Assembly every Monday. All students and members of the staff are required to be present at the General Assembly. A special fine will be imposed in case students do not observe this rule.

2. Attendance of lectures:

Students are required to attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered in each subject, failing which, a student will not be allowed to appear in Annual Examination. However, students participating in college academic, co-academic and sports activities will be given compensatory lectures as per university rules.

3. Monthly Tests for all classes

- ❖ I Students of all odd semester classes are required to appear in monthly tests in September, October & November. Students of all even semester classes are required to appear in monthly tests in Feb, March, and April. The duration of monthly test in September, November, February and April will be of 45 minutes consisting of 15 marks, whereas, it will be of 1.30 hours in October and March consisting of 40 marks.
- ❖ According to Punjab University rules 10% internal assessment will be calculated on the proposed formula in order to maintain uniformity in calculating the internal assessment in Under Graduate semester classes by all the affiliated colleges of Punjab University
- ❖ Class Test 5% ii) Academic Activities (Seminar, Project and Assignment) 3% iii) Attendance 2% I The Principal at her discretion may give a special test for valid reasons to the students who fail to quality class tests but the students can not claim it as a matter of right. I If any student is found guilty of copying, she will be fined and serious action will be taken against her.

4. LEAVE RULES

1. Leave will have to be applied on special form available from the office. Application on simple paper will not be accepted
2. Sick leave form must be supported with Medical Certificate.
3. Student must have applied for leave before absencing herself from the college. In case of illness or emergency the leave application must be sent immediately and Photostat copy be kept by the student.



5. DISCIPLINE :

1. It is the first and the foremost duty of students to maintain discipline in the college.
2. Students should be courteous in their dealings with the college employees and one another. They should avoid making a noise in the rooms, the verandas and the compound.
3. Movement from one class room to another should be orderly, disciplined and dignified. At the end of the period, students ,already occupying the class room have to vacate it.
4. The college property should in no way be tampered with or disfigured. The defacing of walls and furniture with pencil or chalk marks or ink spots and spitting in the college compound are strictly prohibited.
5. In vacant period, the students are advised to go to the reading room and devote their time in reading magazines and newspapers. They are advised not to loiter here and there.
6. The students should cultivate the queue habit while they go to see the Principal, to pay dues in the Accounts Office, to get books issued from the library etc.
7. Inside a class, perfect discipline and order must be maintained and instructions of the teacher should be strictly carried out.
8. Every student is bound to work for the development of the college.
9. Students are not allowed to sit in the moped stand and cycle stand.
10. All quarrels and disputes with fellow students should be avoided. In case of disputes, students should not take the law into their own hands but report immediately to the Principal.
11. The students should not pluck flowers.
12. All concessions and stipends will be withdrawn for misconduct or taking part in strikes. Punishment on this account can lead to heavy fine or even suspension from the college depending on the seriousness of the guilt.

14. Every student is expected to wish the staff members.
15. Students must inform the college office about change in their permanent address, if any.
16. Principal's permission must be obtained for holding meeting in the college premises.
17. Any notice, not bearing signatures of the Principal does not have any validity.
18. Bicycles/Scooters/Mopeds are to be kept locked in the cycle shed. The college will not be responsible for any loss.
19. The students are advised not to wear jewellery in the college time.
20. Use dustbin for waste paper material.

6. Prizes

To encourage performance in studies, prizes are awarded to the students on the basis of their academic excellence, subject to certain rules which are notified to the students at the beginning of the academic year. i.e. students must have passed in all subjects. Recognition is given for University result and special prizes and certificates are awarded for distinction in academic, co-academic and sports activities Prize for maximum attendance in the Library is also given.

Note : The students who fail to attend rehearsal before the Prize Distribution Function will not be given their prizes afterwards.

Best Student Prize : A special prize for all round best student is given to a student of the final year class who distinguishes herself in academic, co-academic and sports activities and has shown exemplary conduct during



7. PHYSICAL EDUCATION, SPORTS & GAMES

1. All students are expected and encouraged to play games. Adequate arrangements by way of ground etc. exist for Kabbadi, Table Tennis, Badminton, Volleyball, Kho-Kho, Athletics, Karate, Boxing, Weight Lifting, Judo and Taekwondo. The college also has a Gym.
2. Absentees in games will be fined 2/- per day. All students participating in games must equip themselves with proper sports wear.

8. Withdrawal of Names:

An application for withdrawal of name must be made by the Parents/Guardians otherwise the student is liable to pay all college dues incurred by not withdrawing her name.

9. College Magazine:

The College Magazine 'Avastha' is published every year. Students are encouraged to contribute articles, poems, short stories etc. to the various sections of college magazine. The magazine provides a healthy platform to the students to explore their writing abilities.

10. Library Rules:

The college has air conditioned, fully furnished and well equipped library with Reading Room & Reference Section with more than 28487 books on all subjects. It subscribes to 16 Newspapers and 60 Periodicals along with internet facility for free e-journals for the benefit of students and the staff members. The college also provides Book Bank facility. In the Current session as many as 40 students of the College got benefited from the Book bank for the whole session. Software Advanta has been installed and is being used. The following rules of the library should be observed by the students.

- Students will be supplied with identity card and two Readers' tickets.
- Identity Card & Readers tickets are not transferable. The librarian can at any time, call upon a student to produce her identity card in support of her claim to draw a book on a particular ticket. Student will be responsible for books drawn from the library on their ticket.
- Loss of identity card or tickets must be immediately reported to the Librarian to avoid misuse of it by any one else. A sum of Rs. 50/- will be charged for issue of a duplicate identity card & Rs. 5/- for duplicate Readers ticket.
- The books will be issued to all the students for a period of fourteen days only including the day of issue.
- A fine of Rs. 2/- shall be charged per day per volume kept after the due date.
- Any one, who loses, defaces or otherwise damages a book or Journal or a paper by tearing or removing pages shall have to bear the cost of replacement. In case the book is one of a set and is not available separately, the student shall have to bear the cost of the replacement of the entire set.
- There is annual stock checking in the library. All books borrowed from the library will have to be returned by the time notified for this purpose.
- Students and teachers voluntarily donate books in the book bank. To make the Book Bank upto date, new books are also purchased and added every year.
- Students are not allowed to bring their own books in the library.
- Money once deposited for the loss of books, is not refundable.
- Students are advised to read magazines, periodicals and journals in the library but these will not be issued for home.
- An issued book can be called back by the librarian at any time.
- If there is a holiday on the day of return, the next day will be automatically considered.
- A student who has maximum sitting in the library will be awarded Prize for making full utilization of library. Students are required to sign the visitors' Register kept at the entrance, can do so before entering the library.



- One passport size photographs be deposited in the library for identity card at the time of admission.
- Photostat facility is available in the library from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm
- Books will be issued from Monday to Saturday during 9:30 am to 2:00 pm

11. (Not Me Not You But We) N.S.S

Two Units of N.S.S are working in the college in which 200 students can become members every year. Every student of the college is expected to be the volunteer of the N.S.S. unit and N.S.S unit for their better growth in the college. The volunteers will be awarded certificates A, B or C, if they fulfill the requirements outlined by the N.S.S Coordinator in the revised guidelines given by the Syndicate. A weightage of 1% at the time of next admission is given to the volunteers who have attended 7 days N.S.S. Day and Night camp. Some jobs are reserved for N.S.S volunteers in Central Govt. jobs.

12. Tutorial Group

Every student is assigned a Tutorial group under the guidance of Mr. Kamalpreet Singh, who is expected to guide each one of her wards. Tutorial group meeting will be held twice in the month in special period. Students will be divided into small tutorial groups and taught about moral values like Discipline, Social Manners, Cleanliness, Interdisciplinary topics like Computer education, Home Management, Library awareness, Banking, Small savings, Public Speaking, Health and Traffic rules.

13. National Cadet Corps (Army Wing)

An NCC Unit of 53 girl cadets under 4 Punjab Girls BN NCC, Patiala, exists in the college under the Guidance of Lieutenant Dr. Goldy Garg The aim of NCC is to impart field training to the cadets, expose cadets to team work, inculcate spirit of adventure and endurance and to instill in them the value of discipline, integrity, team spirit and dignity of labour. NCC 'C' certificate holders have a number of benefits, such as:

1. 20% vacancies are reserved for them in short service commission(Non-Technical) for women.
2. In navy, six vacancies are reserved per course with SSB interview, no UPSC exam required & two years age relaxation is provided.
3. In Air Force 10% weightage is given in all courses including flying training courses with only SSB interview. No UPSC exam is required.
4. In Para-Military forces 2 to 10 bonus marks are awarded for recruitment.
5. In Department of telecom, bonus marks are awarded.
6. State Government gives preference for State Services in certain States.
7. In private sector, many industries give preference to NCC cadets for various jobs.
8. Sahara Scholarship: Educational Scholarship of Rs. 12000/- each is given to 380 cadets.
9. NCC Scholarship: A Scholarship of Rs. 6000 each to 1000 cadets including 250 cadets from rural/ disturbed areas is awarded.

14. Career Counseling & Guidance Cell

The college has set up a Career Counseling & Guidance Cell to help & guide outgoing students of the college about further career options. The students get guidance through various lectures by intellectuals from different fields.



15. Remedial Classes

Special/Remedial Classes are arranged in the College for students who are weak in studies. Coaching is also provided to SC/BC students without any payment of fee.

16. College Canteen

College has a spacious canteen with newly added furniture for students. The canteen provides a fresh variety of eatables, lunch & tea snacks.

17. Suggestion Box

Suggestion box has been placed in Visitors' Room in front of Principal Office in the College. Students and Parents are requested to put their suggestions in this box for the welfare of students and the institution.

18. Principal –Parent – Teacher Meetings

Principal – Parent –Teacher Meetings will be held in each term immediately after October Test & March, test, as per schedule mentioned in Academic Calendar. It is compulsory for the parents to attend these meetings.

19. Principal -Alumni - Teacher Meetings

Principal – Alumni - Teacher Meetings will be held in the month of March, 2023.

20. Central Association

The Central Association of the college comprises of students from all categories like Sports, Academic and Co-academic activities. The President, Vice President, Secretary, Joint Secretary of Central Association assist the College administrator in maintenance of discipline and cleanliness and in solving all the problems of the College.

21. Special Classes

Special classes will be Arranged for those students who fall short of lectures as per University rules due to participation in Co-academic/Sports activities or due to Medical cause. Shortage of Lectures before Autumn/Winter Break will have to be covered by attending classes in Autumn/Winter Break. If any student fails to cover the lecture shortage her name will be struck off from the college rolls.

22. Special Test

Those students who fail to qualify the conditions of class tests as per Academic Calendar given on page numbers 4 and 5, due to Co-academic/Sports Activities or due to Medical Cause will have to appear in Special Test of the concerned subject in the Recess period as announced at that time. In case a student fails to appear in any of these examinations, she will not be allowed to appear as regular student.



THE COLLEGE HOSTEL

The college offers hostel accommodation with all the modern amenities and a peaceful atmosphere conducive for studies. The number of seats are limited, so candidates desirous of residing in the hostel must get their seats reserved immediately at the time of admission to the college. A separate form for admission to the hostel is supplied with the prospectus, to be filled in by the boarders.

RULES FOR HOSTELLERS

- The hostellers are not allowed to take their guests to their rooms.
- Day scholars are not allowed to visit the hostel.
- Hostellers are not allowed to keep more than Rs. 500/- with them.
- Hostellers are advised not to wear gold or precious jewellery.
- Hostellers should study in their own rooms.
- Light and fan must be switched off when not in use.
- Hostel rooms and lobby must be kept clean.
- Hostellers are not allowed to go to the warden's or teacher's room under any circumstances.
- Hostellers are not allowed to take food in their rooms.
- No electrical device (like Iron or Heater) is allowed in the Hostel.
- Whenever any student wants Home-Leave, she must fill her accurate address in the weekend register.
- Hostel gates close by 7.00 p.m. All girls are required to mark their attendance in the attendance register.
- Every hosteller will be issued a separate Hostel Identity Card depicting the details and photographs of her family members and at the most two relatives who are allowed to visit the college campus. It must be deposited at time of admission.
- If any girl wants to go outside the college, she will have to get the written permission from the College Principal.
- Discipline should be maintained at all cost.

Note

Hostellers are responsible for the safe-keeping of their money, belongings, clothes etc. On personal request from the parents of wards; hostellers can go home on special occasions. Parents must cooperate with the college authorities in maintaining discipline in the college and the

RULES FOR THE VISITORS

- ❖ Visitors are allowed to visit their wards during specified days and hours only.
- ❖ Visitors may visit boarders on Saturdays after 2:00 pm and on Sundays 9:00 am to 5:00 pm in Winter and in Summer - Saturday 2:00pm to 7:00 pm & Sunday 10:00 am to 6:00 pm.
- ❖ Visitors are allowed only in the visiting room.
- ❖ No Visitor will be allowed on odd days or during odd hours.
- ❖ Any exception to visiting time or person must be approved by the warden.
- ❖ No guest will be allowed to stay in the hostel for the night, not even female guests.
- ❖ The visitors must sign the Visitor's Register at the gate before entering.
- ❖ Visitors will be allowed to see a boarder only upon presentation of the visitor's identification card issued by the college and signed by the parents.
- ❖ Parking is prohibited outside the hostel area.

HOSTEL DUES : The hostel dues will be Rs. 14,000/- For Non A.C. Room & Rs.20,000 for A.C. Room per annum, payable in two instalments, one at the time of admission and second in the first week of December 2023 Mess fee of Rs. 2000/- per month will be charged.



FEES / FUNDS / CHARGES



RULES FOR PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES

- The College dues for all classes will be collected from the students during session 2023-2024 as per programme:-
 - i) At the time of admission for 6 months will be charged including university exam fee for 1st semester.
 - ii) Fee for 3 months will be charged in the month of October 2023.
 - iii) Fee for 3 months including University exam fee for 2nd semester will be submit in the month of January 2024.
- The schedule for collecting college dues from classes having semester system will be put up well in time before the prescribed date for the payment of such dues.
- Students are required to pay all their dues on dates notified well in advance. Defaulters have to pay their dues with in ten days with the late fine under rules.
- The names of students who fail to pay the dues with in this stipulated period may be struck off the college rolls. They may, however, re – join after paying the arrears of Fee. Re-admission fee of Rs. 170/ but no benefit of lectures on account of absence can be claimed by them. The Principal may at her discretion, refuse to re-admit any student without assigning any reason for the same.
- All security deposit will be refunded to the student on her leaving the college, provided she has cleared all the dues. Security refund can be claimed within six months of her leaving the college. No application for refund will be entertained after the expiry of the time limit. All securities not withdrawn within six months of leaving the college shall lapse automatically.
- All dues shall be paid in the College Accounts Office on the specified dates otherwise fine will be charged as per rules.
- If applied to the Principal at least two days prior to the payment of fee , extension of date of payment may be granted
- Fee can be paid Cash / Bank Draft / online mode . Fee and Fines once paid will not be refundable
- If dues remain unpaid till the last date of the month, the student's name will be struck off from the College rolls.
- In case a student leaves the College during any term of the session, she will have to pay for the whole period.
- The students should check their receipts before leaving the fee counter. Once she leaves the counter, the Office will not be responsible for any discrepancies.

FEE CONCESSION & SCHOLARSHIPS

Fee Concession:

1. Fee concession, as admissible under Govt. rules is awarded to deserving students. There is also a provision to give help for purchase of clothes and medicines from the 'Students Aid' fund to the needy students.
2. **The concession is only in tuition fee and not in funds.** All concessions are conditional depending upon a student's good conduct, regular attendance and progress in studies. If a student fails in any House examination, she will not be entitled for fee concession from retrospective effect. Students who are awarded scholarships will not be given any concession in fee.
3. Sports Achievers, Co-academic/Youth Festival Achievers will be given fee concession as per decided by the Management / Principal during the current session.
4. In Academics, 100%, 75% and 50% fee concession (College Funds) will be granted to the students who bag 1st, 2nd and 3rd position respectively in the University.

Facilities for students belonging to Schedule Caste & Backward Classes:

Schedule Caste & Backward Class students are provided with special facilities of scholarship & stipend during their study period. 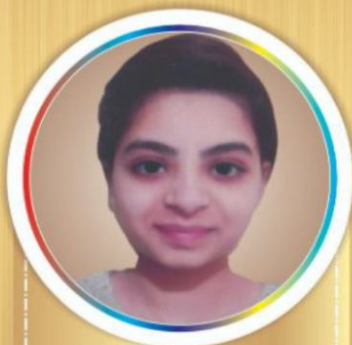
