03 faculty members are the member of U.G Board of Studies in English, Sanskrit, Economics and 02 members are the part of the Faculty of the Languages.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Adopting innovative teaching pedagogies is our main objective and major strength. Group discussion, debates, tutorial, seminars, study tours etc. are adopted for proper understanding of subjects and thereby ensuring efficient teaching-learning process. Dean Academics ensures the preparation of workloads, time-tables for different disciplines and well defined unitization of syllabus by each staff member. Well stocked Library facility. National Seminars, Workshop, extension lectures, Conferences are also organized. Teachers are encouraged to attend Faculty Development Program such as Orientation Programs, Refresher Courses, Seminars and Workshops. Faculty Members are also encouraged to undertake research activities.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

To evaluate performance of the students, 1<sup>st</sup> Term and 2<sup>nd</sup> Term House Tests are conducted in September and December according to University rules. Results are sent to their parents. Internal assessment based on the marks secured by students in house tests is sent to the Controller of Exam P.U. through software provided by the University. Through different type of evaluation methods ,transparency is achieved. University appoints examination officers to ensure smooth conduct of University exams. College appoints Centre Supdt., Deputy Supdt., Asstt. Supdts. and other staff for the examination. Teacher-wise results are examined by the Governing Body of the college. To evaluate the performance of teaching and learning, feedback is taken from students, alumni, parents and other stakeholders.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development:

The college encourages the teachers for research work. The college is already having 08 Ph.D teachers. Teachers are encouraged to attend Seminars/ Conferences/Workshops and submit proposals for projects. Eminent scholars / researchers are invited to deliver extension lectures for the benefits of students. During 2011-12, 02 faculty member completed Ph.D and also 03 faculty members completed M.Phil. 11 faculty members presented research paper at National/International/State Level and 06 research papers have been published in reputedJournals.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has well stocked library. During 2011-12, 1578 Text-Books worth Rs. 3,09,723, 43 Reference Books worth Rs. 71,654, 85 Journals worth Rs. 63,269 were purchased. Labs are regularly updated, General and account offices are computerized, Teachers are encouraged to teach with LCD Projectors and OHP projectors. A sum of Rs. 69,207 was spent on the maintenance and upgradation of Computer facility and Regular upgradation of infrastructure is done.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

IQAC allocates subjects to the teaching staff according to their area of specialisation and experience. College Advisory Committee, Examination Committee, Library Committee etc. along with Dean Academics, Dean Co-academics and Dean Sports plan and implement the activities of the session. Evaluation of the teachers is done through Annual Confidential Report, additional increments, Self-appraisal report and API Proformas. A College has made 25 Different Committees for performing proper functionality of work.

The team stood 4th in overall boxing championship at Panjab Uni. Chandigarh. One student got selected for all India Boxing Inter -University competition held at Lovely University.
- Wrestling Team of the college participated in Inter -College tournament at Panjab University, Chandigarh. Two students won Bronze medal.
- Athletics Team of the college participated in Inter -College tournament at Panjab University, Chandigarh. The event for which they competed were:-800m Long jump, 1500m, 200m, 4x100m, Relay 400m, Shot put.
- An Inter college Table Tennis competition held at Panjab University Chandigarh. Our college team participated in this competition. Our Table Tennis players attended the North Zone All India Inter University Camp at Panjab University Chandigarh and our one girl was selected for North Zone All India Inter University competition held at Ruderpur (Nanital).

## Problem encountered and Sources required:-
